What is EVANDE project about?

EVANDE is a European funded (2015-2016) project targeting to the training of civil protection volunteers and local authorities' staff on the topics of floods, forest fires, earthquakes and European civil protection policies.

Additionally, the EVANDE project aims to the exchange of experiences in order to strengthen the cross-border collaboration and effectiveness of civil protection policies and activities among the participating countries and the involved target groups.

Project activities and outcomes

The main EVANDE activities and outcomes include the following:

Publication of technical reports

EVANDE produced and published four technical reports on floods, forest fires, earthquakes and European civil protection policies, which serve also the needs of the training activities. These publications together with a Best Practices Booklet summarize the results of the research and the experience from all participating countries and can be found at the project's webpage.

Training and development of an e-learning platform

The main outcome of the EVANDE project is the development of an e-learning platform to train local authorities' staff and civil protection volunteers on floods, forest fires, earthquakes and European civil protection policies.
