



Emergency and regional police Department



Emergency Department and the Interior has the responsibility for Civil Protection of the Xunta de Galicia mainly in the following areas:

- a) The management on civil protection regional plans and restoration of essential services for citizens affected by an emergency, in collaboration with the Galician Agency Emergency and in the context of the functions attributed to it by law 5 /2007, emergency Galicia.
- b) **Planning** of civil protection and **prevention**, **forecasting and risk analysis**, in collaboration with the Galician Emergency Management Agency.
- c) The representation of the Regional Government in the **National Commission for Civil Protection** and other international organizations, and regional coordination of civil protection.

- d) The establishment of guidelines and protocols for each associated to each plan or risk.
- e) The exercise of **planning and coordination** of plans and programs of the authorities, in **collaboration** with the **Galician Emergency Management Agency** without prejudice to the competences that may correspond to the **Local Government**.
- f) The relationship of the autonomous administration in the field of emergency response with local governments, with the autonomous communities, the General Administration of the State, having a special relationship with Portugal because of its proximity and the possibility of having to share common emergencies.
- g) Developing of the **nuclear and natural radiation control** and monitoring depending on the Spanish Nuclear Safety Council.
- h) Drills organisation: Chemical industries (Seveso), Territorial Plans, Floods, Aircraft crashes, etc.

More than 40,000 ships a year with dangerous goods. Examples: Year 2002.Prestige. 1992, Aegean Sea 1976, Urquiola




Figura 1. Zonificación de Galicia segundo risco de nevaradas e placas de xeo.



Dangerous goods transports




CRITERIA:

High risks: Municipalities with population in a distance of 200 meters from the routes of these kind of transports.

Moderate risk: Municipalities with at least two petrol stations.

Low risk: Rest of municipalities






